Padraic Kenney, Professor of History at Indiana University, has written extensively on the experience of workers in early Communist Poland, on the gendered nature of anti-communist opposition, on social movements in the fall of communism in Central Europe—*A Carnival of Revolution* (2002)—and on Eastern Europe's road from communism—*The Burdens of Freedom* (2006). His publications have been translated into seven languages thus far. He has also taught and written on problems of transnational history and on the role of historical memory in contemporary politics. He is currently researching a book on political prisoners in the twentieth-century world. His latest book—*1989: Democratic Revolutions at the Cold War's End*—will be published this December.
